What will I do as a MPI & USF summer intern?

- Work in the Cedro Galán primary care clinic
- Help implement MPI's current health programs in the other community we serve (Villa Guadalupe)
- Work alongside Nicaraguan health professionals in local hospitals
- Assist with MPI's other programs, including English, business development, exercise, and nutrition
- Complete research projects as needed by MPI (MCOM Scholarly Concentration funding available)
- Create sustainable relationships with community members as well as Nicaraguan health students and professionals with opportunities to return to Nicaragua as senior students

Who is eligible? Any graduate student at USF Health.

How long are the internships and how much do they cost?

4 weeks, \$1,600 plus airfare (MPI can support fundraising efforts)
